Private Organizations

What is a private organization? It is an organization or club formed by a group of people in their personal capacities. It is not part of the federal government—even if the members of the organization are all federal government employees. It may operate on a military installation with the written consent of the installation commander. It must comply with the requirements of AFI 34-223, *Private Organization (PO) Program.* Small unofficial activities (like coffee funds, flower funds, sunshine funds, etc.) are generally not considered private organizations, though they are bound by AFI 34-223 as well.

Can a private organization be sued? Yes. It would be up to the private organization to respond to any lawsuit. For example, if a private organization served a "bad" hot dog to a guest on the installation and the guest was hospitalized, the private organization could be held responsible for any and all medical expenses incurred by the ill guest. For this reason, private organizations should always consider having insurance. If the bills or expenses of a private organization exceed the resources of the organization, the private organization's constitution and by-laws will dictate who is liable. For most private organizations, the members of the private organization are responsible for paying the bills and expenses of the organization. For example, if the private organization signs a contract for \$10K, but only has \$5K, then the members of the organization will have to come up with the remainder of the money from their personal funds—or risk being sued.

The commander may withdraw the authorization if the private organization prejudices or discredits the United States Government, conflicts with Government activities, or for any other reason or just cause.

Fundraising

In general, there is no fundraising in JBSA. However, fundraising may be allowed on a case by case basis with approval under AFI 34-223. In JBSA, the FSS Commander/Director has been delegated approval authority.

Each private organization is limited to two events per quarter and will not allow commercial sponsorships. (In general, NAF and MWR are the organizations on base that are allowed commercial sponsorships—no POs). Members working for a PO during a fundraiser must be in a non-duty status during the fundraiser (leave, pass) and must not be in uniform. Few fundraisers are allowed during the Combined Federal Campaign or Air Force Assistance Fund. Requests to conduct games of chance to include bingo, lotteries or other gambling activities are subject to very strict rules and are typically not approved. Raffles may be held under special circumstances; complying with AFI 34-223 requirements as well as state and county regulations.
