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## **Sports Physicals:**

Dependent upon each school district. Good rule of thumb is to have the physical completed after April of the year entering 7<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade or if this is your first year entering the school district.

# Mandatory School Vaccines (IAW Texas Guidelines):

- 4 6 y/o require: 1 DTaP, Polio, MMR, and Varicella (they need to have received these vaccines between this age range).
  - 11 y/o require: 1 TDaP and Meningococcal.
    - 16 y/o require: Meningococcal booster.

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## Do you need Before and After School Care?

## Visit Militarychildcare.com

- Request Before and After School Care (servicing Installation ISDs)
  - 5-12 years old
  - Fees: DoD Standard Weekly subsidized rates based on Total Family Income (TFI)
  - Priority: Based on your Military Family Type (Active-Duty Military, Single/Dual, DoD Civilian, etc)
- Child & Youth Program Business Management System (CYPBMS)
  - Electronic Registration System for all JBSA Child & Youth Programs
  - Contact CYP at your installation to initiate a family account

## JBSA School Age Care (SAC) Program:

- Accredited through the Council on Accreditation (COA)
- Receives Annual Unannounced HHQ Inspections to ensure compliance with regulations
- Field trips offered during school breaks to local San Antonio attractions





## JBSA Child Care Initiatives

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## **Current JBSA CDC Capacity: 1,000 Spaces**

- Three new CDCs- Fort Sam Houston groundbreaking April 2024
- Randolph two CDCs (275 spaces), Lackland three CDCs (550 spaces), Fort Sam Houston two CDCs (165 spaces)

## Family Child Care (FCC) – CDC alternative option

- In the last 12 months FSH FCC providers quadrupled Number of childcare spaces increased from 6 to 24!
- JBSA Total: 13 active providers 68 enrolled/78 capacity FSH: 4 on-installation, LKD: 3 on-installation/2 off-installation, RND: 4 off-installation
- 6 Provider Applicants in-process: 1 FSH on-installation, 3 RND off-installation, 2 LKD on-installation

## **Brighton Center Partnership- serves children with special needs**

- 502 FSS developing a pilot program funding proposal to AFSVC to have Brighton Center facilitate inclusion support services within our JBSA Child & Youth Programs.
- **Next Steps**: Identify capabilities to include in the proposal, projected costs associated with services, and finalize pilot submission to Air Force Services. Estimated Completion Date for proposal submission: 4-6 weeks.

## Pre-K 4 SA Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)- Signed 17 Jul – CDC alterative care option

- Partnership provides child care options in the community.
- Future: Exploring transportation options for families who live on installation; potential for growth to 24-hour care
- Over 300 military children already enrolled
- 2025-2026 School year enrollment begins December 1, 2024 for JBSA

## Online ID Card Renewal

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## Purpose:

- Sponsors can renew eligible dependent ID cards online and have the new card mailed to them directly!
  - Dependent must already be enrolled in DEERS
  - Sponsor cannot replace their own ID Card (just the dependents)
  - Dependents 17 years and under need a photo less than 12 years old in DEERS
  - Dependents 18 years and over two forms of ID and photo less than 12 years old in DEERS

## **Instructions:**

- Sponsors can follow the below instructions to order their dependent's ID Card:
  - Search <a href="https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/">https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/</a> (or scan QR code)
  - Select the "Family ID Cards" hyperlink
  - Select DS login or CAC
  - Enter your information
  - Select "Request New ID" next to the desired dependent
    - System will notify you if you meet new requirements
    - If approved, DMDC will process and mail the ID to the address on file in DEERS (two week turn around)
      - The local ID card office <u>IS NOT</u> involved in this process at all
    - Please do not request a dependent's ID at an ID Card office if you began this process online

# JBSA Youth Supervision Guidelines

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## **Policy Governed By**

- DoD Instruction 6060.02 Heads of the DoD Components shall: Require that all military installations under their authority follow guidance that addresses the ages and circumstances under which a child under 13 years of age can be left at home alone without adult supervision, also known as a "home alone policy," or "self-care policy."
- Air Force Instruction 34-114 Develop a policy in conjunction with local agencies that addresses when a child under the age of 13 can be home alone without adult supervision on the installation. The installation commander should approve the policy in consultation with the installation director of the Family Advocacy Program. (T-0)

## Unaccompanied Youth Access to Facilities

STATE WITH

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### Youth under the age of 18 during unstaffed/Fitness Access hours:

Youth under the age of 18 (excluding all Active Duty) are prohibited from using unstaffed fitness facilities.

#### Youth 16 years of age and over:

During staffed hours of operation are permitted in all areas of the Fitness and Sports Center without a parent/legal guardian. Youth must present military ID to the front desk for entrance.

#### Youth 13 - 15 years of age:

During staffed hours of operation are permitted in cardiovascular, weight equipment, group exercise rooms, locker rooms, saunas, etc., only under parent/legal guardian interactive supervision. Interactive supervision requires parent/legal guardian and child to participate in/perform activity together at all times.

#### Youth 6 - 12 years of age:

Not permitted in cardiovascular, sauna, weight equipment rooms, or group exercise rooms during scheduled adult exercise classes. Other activity areas (basketball court, racquetball courts, running track) requires interactive supervision from a parent/legal guardian at all times. Interactive supervision requires parent/legal guardian and child to participate in/perform activity together at all times.

#### Children under 6 years of age:

Not permitted in Fitness and Sports Centers except as follows: Permitted in Fitness and Sports Center parent (legal guardian) and child areas for supervised play\*\*. Permitted to be a participant (participating in age-appropriate programming) or spectator in a sports activity or special event under parent or legal guardian interactive supervision. Interactive supervision requires parent/legal guardian and child to participate in/perform activity together at all times.



## Unaccompanied Youth Access to Facilities

Ft. Sam Houston- Youth ages 13 and above are allowed unaccompanied at aquatics facilities Randolph- Youth ages 11 and above are allowed unaccompanied at aquatics facilities Lackland- Youth ages 11 and above are allowed unaccompanied at aquatics facilities **Note:** 

Ft. Sam Houston has a different unaccompanied age limit due to depth of the pool and features of the pool.

#### **JBSA Youth Programs:**

Youth ages 9-18 yrs. old can attend Youth Programs (open recreation) after school and weekend hours to enjoy fun filled activities that are provided by staff. 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
