To better serve our community, we have recently realigned our support into three regions: Western, Central, and Eastern; encompassing the JBSA installations and their surrounding school districts.

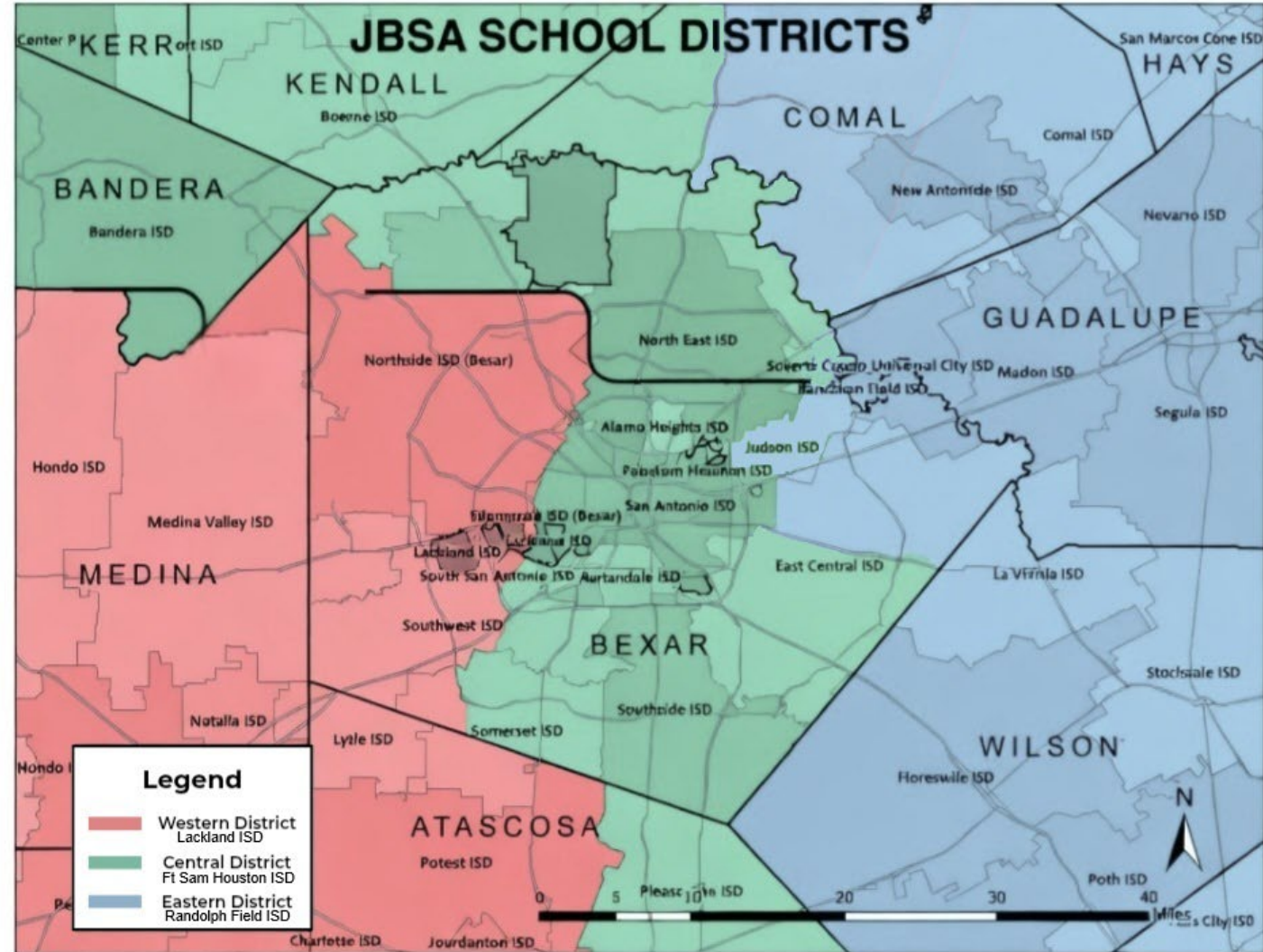

TEA Standard Procedures for PSMIs – Requirements for schools located on TX Military Installations

Legal Framework	Governed by Texas Education Code (TEC) §§11.352, 21.04, 11.061, and Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 61.
Trustee Requirements	Must be a qualified voter residing or employed on the installation. Serves a two-year term and must take an oath of office.
Application Process	Candidates submit resumes and qualification statements within a 14-business-day window.
Final Approval	A panel recommends a candidate, and the final nomination package is submitted to the TEA for the official appointment.

JBSA Local Procedures (JBSA Only) – Process developed locally to meet specific needs.

Vacancy Announcements	The School Liaison publicizes openings through various installation channels 6 months ahead of vacancy.
Application Management	The School Liaison is the central point for receiving, reviewing, and documenting all applications.
Panel & Evaluation	A Trustee Nomination Panel, guided by a facilitator, interviews and scores all qualified candidates.
Recommendation & Routing	The panel's recommendation is compiled and routed to the Installation Commander for signature. Once TEA approves, the local school district is notified.

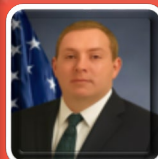

Family Child Care (FCC) – CDC alternative option

- JBSA Total: Eight active providers, three inactive providers – 65 enrolled/40 capacity
 - Fort Sam Houston: one on-installation, Lackland: two on-installation/two off-installation, and Randolph: three off-installation
- 10 Provider Applicants in-process: five Fort Sam Houston off post, five Lackland on base, and five Randolph off base.

Brighton Center Partnership – serves children with special needs

- 502d FSS developed a pilot program with Brighton Center to facilitate inclusion support services within our JBSA Child & Youth Programs (CYP)
- Brighton Center proposed expanding the partnership beyond offering specialized childcare to offer inclusion support services within on-installation CYPs (embedded Behavioral Specialist, therapists, preschool intervention team, and specialized training support)
- **Next Steps:** Service pilot on hold due to current Government budget constraints. Once funding is available, AFSVC will move forward with implementation of the Inclusion Support Pilot at Main CDC, JBSA-Randolph

Pre-K 4 SA Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – CDC alternative care option

- Partnership provides childcare options in the community
- Over 300 military children already enrolled
- 2026 – 2027 School year enrollment begins 1 Feb 2026, and child's age must be three – four years old by 1 Sep 2026

Just a few, **FIRE SAFETY TOPIC** reminders:

Space Heaters –

Although temperatures in our area are fluctuating, cooler conditions may still lead personnel to use space heaters.

- Keep all combustible materials at least 3 feet from space heaters.
- Always plug heaters directly into a wall outlet, never use an extension cord or power strip.
- Ensure heaters are equipped with an automatic shut-off feature in case they tip over.
- Only use heaters that are UL-listed or certified by a recognized testing laboratory.
- Turn off and unplug heaters when not in use. Never leave them unattended.

Lithium-ion Batteries -

- Use only approved and certified products. Look for safety certification marks such as UL, ETL, or CSA.
- Always charge devices using the original cables and chargers provided by the manufacturer.
- Do not overcharge! Unplug devices once they are fully charged to prevent overheating and always follow manufactures instructions for safe use and charging.
- Stop using the device immediately if the battery emits an unusual smell, becomes excessively hot, makes a popping or hissing sound and changes shape or color.
- Dispose of batteries properly. Never throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash/recycling bin.
- Use designated battery recycling or hazardous waste collection sites to prevent fire hazards.

1. Children at Play: School's Out!

Expect the Unexpected: With school out, more children are biking, skating, and playing near streets.

Slow Down in Housing: Strictly adhere to residential speed limits. A few extra seconds can prevent a tragedy.

Heads Up, Phones Down: Avoid all distractions. Stay vigilant, especially near parks, community centers, and crosswalks.

2. Navigating Construction Zones

Obey the Signs: Reduced speed limits in construction zones are mandatory, not suggested.

Lane Changes & Merging: Be patient and predictable. Merge early and give other drivers space.

Watch for Workers & Equipment: Construction personnel and heavy machinery require extra room. Give them a wide berth.

3. Additional Summer Driving Tips

Beat the Heat: Never leave children or pets in a vehicle, even for a minute. The inside temperature can become lethal in a very short time.

Tire & Vehicle Checks: Hot pavement increases the risk of tire blowouts. Ensure your tires are properly inflated and your vehicle is maintained.

Share the Road: Be mindful of increased motorcycle, bicycle, and pedestrian traffic during warmer months.

Bottom Line: Your awareness and patience are key to a safe summer for everyone on base

What Our 3 Year Mishap Data is Telling Us:

- Our biggest threats are not from extreme or unusual events
- They are from **routine, everyday activities** where we lose situational awareness

Key Message: Small changes in our daily habits can prevent the majority of injuries



JBSA Safety

The "Hidden" #1 Cause of Injury: Ergonomics

- The Data: Strains & lifting injuries are the most frequent cause of on-duty mishaps
- Context: People are getting hurt during routine tasks: moving water jugs, rearranging office furniture, and pushing heavy gates

Preventive Action:

- Ask for a "team lift" for anything heavy or awkward.
- Use mechanical aids (dollies, carts) whenever they are available.

Motor Vehicle Mishaps: It's Not the Highway, It's the Parking Lot

- The Data: Over 70 motor vehicle mishaps were recorded, mostly from low-speed errors.
- The Context: Most of our vehicle accidents are from striking fixed objects (poles, signs) and backing-up incidents.

Preventive Action:

- Treat parking lots as high-hazard zones. **SLOW DOWN**.
- Mandatory for GMVs: If you have a passenger, you **MUST** use them as a spotter when backing up
- Perform a 360-degree walk-around before driving

Gravity Always Wins: Slips, Trips, and Falls

- The Data: We recorded 58 distinct Slip, Trip, and Fall mishaps, plus another 18 hidden within other reports
- The Context: These happen everywhere—transitioning from wet pavement to tile, tripping over unsecured cables, or missing a step

Preventive Action:

- Adopt a "Spot It, Clear It" mentality - If you see a hazard, don't just step over it — fix it
- Maintain good housekeeping in your workspaces

Summary: Our Path Forward

- **Team Lifts:** Don't lift heavy items alone
- **Slow Down:** Be extra cautious in parking lots
- **Be Proactive:** Fix hazards you see
