Bird/Wildlife Aircraft Strike Hazard Risk Mitigation through Habitat Management,
JBSA-Randolph, TX

The Environmental Assessment is prepared in accordance with National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) (42 United States Code [USC] § 4321 et seq.), the President's Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) *Regulations Implementing the Procedural Provisions of NEPA* (40 Code of Federal Regulations [CFR] §§ 1500–1508), the United States Air Force (USAF) Environmental Impact Analysis Process (EIAP) (32 CFR § 989), Protection of Historic Properties (36 CFR § 800), and the National Preservation Programs (54 USC Subtitle III DIVISION A) to evaluate the potential environmental consequences associated with implementing a habitat management project to mitigate the bird/wildlife aircraft strike hazard (BASH) risk at JBSA-Randolph, TX.

The Draft EA demonstrates that the Proposed Action would not significantly impact the environment and supports a FONSI. The Air Force seeks public comments on the draft EA and draft FONSI and will consider all input received before reaching a final decision
