

Status of Animals on JBSA



Wildlife: Native animals living in their natural habitat

Status: Protected by Federal law, Texas law and/or JBSA regulation

Biology: Native to this region and an integral part of the ecosystem

Common on JBSA: Deer, javelina, coyotes, foxes, raccoons, opossums, skunks, birds, & snakes

Actions: Do not feed or approach
May transmit disease or injure humans & pets

Watch from a distance and enjoy!



Pets: Certain breeds of domestic dogs, cats and others as authorized by AFI 32-6000

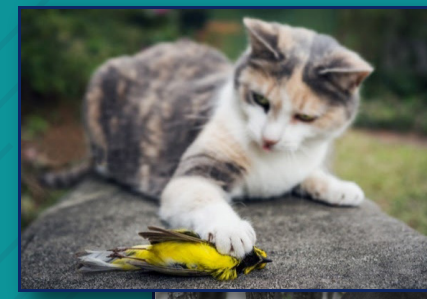
Status: Permitted on JBSA, if they comply with JBSA regulations

Biology: Not native to the area; may harass or harm native species

Actions: Dogs: kept indoors; if outdoors, on a leash or secured within a fenced yard/patio

Cats: kept indoors; if outdoors, under positive control (on a leash or carried)

All pet food is kept indoors, and pets are fed indoors. Water is brought indoors when the pet comes indoors.



Feral animals: Stray cats & dogs, hogs

Status: Not protected nor permitted. Actively sought for removal from JBSA.

Biology: Not native to the area; compete with and/or eat wildlife

Actions: Do not feed or approach
May transmit disease or injure humans & pets
