JBSA Teammates,

Earlier this week we transitioned JBSA from HPCON Charlie to HPCON Bravo, safely reopened fitness centers at reduced capacity, and continued transitioning a limited number of personnel back to office settings.

Although HPCON BRAVO indicates a moderate disease threat and risk of exposure to personnel, I am extending the declaration of a public health emergency in accordance with DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6200.03, “Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Within the DoD,” and AFI 10-2519, “Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern.” This declaration is extended through 30 June 2020 unless it is renewed and re-reported or terminated sooner by me or a senior commander in the chain of command.

As more personnel return to work on the installation, we ask that JBSA leadership and personnel continue to follow the health and safety protocols prescribed by the State, City, and Center for Disease Control in order to protect the JBSA community and lower the risk of community spread of COVID-19. These protocols include but are not limited to: continuing to self-monitor and exercise all previous measures of hygiene, maintaining six feet of physical distancing, wearing face coverings when appropriate, and not exceeding prescribed occupancy rates of facilities and office spaces.

Thank you for your continued support as we work together to ensure the health and safety of our community and the success of our critical missions.
