JBSA Teammates,

As the City of San Antonio reopens the economy in a phased and deliberate manner, JBSA is taking similar actions to change our Health Protection Conditions (HPCON) and expand daily operations. There has been significant progress since the first cases of COVID-19 and subsequent declaration of a Public Health Emergency in March 2020. For this reason, and coupled with the latest Center for Disease Control and Prevention and DOD guidance, we are changing JBSA's HPCON from CHARLIE to BRAVO effective 26 May 2020.

In addition, the installation will discontinue "For Official Business Only" and reinstitute Trusted Traveler access on 26 May, meaning all DOD-affiliated cardholders will have access to the installation and have the ability to vouch for the occupants in their vehicle. Visitor pass procedures will also revert back so commander sponsorship will not be required.

HPCON BRAVO indicates a moderate disease threat and risk of exposure to personnel, and the Public Health Emergency remains in effect on JBSA.

To assist units with operational posturing, additional guidance will be forthcoming from the JBSA Crisis Action Team as we reopen installation services in phases.

In HPCON BRAVO, our facilities and staff will function within the prescribed operating limits of the State, City, and CDC guidelines to lower the risk of spread of COVID-19. These measures include, but are not limited to, continuing to self-monitor and exercise all previous measures of hygiene, maintaining six feet of physical distancing, wearing face coverings when appropriate, and not exceeding prescribed occupancy rates.

This situation is constantly evolving.
